



Active engagement on the part of the learner to experience, reflect, conceptualise and experiment rather than passively listen to lectures is an essential element of the process of learning. ISABS conducts personal growth programs, sensitivity laboratories—at National and Regional events. It also offers long term professional development programs for process facilitation skills, Organisation Development and Community/Social change facilitation and consultancy services. About Human Process Laboratory

In a human process laboratory/ sensitivity laboratory, a group of 8-10 participants work together in small groups, along with 1 or 2 facilitators, for 36 to 40 hours spread over a period of 5-6 days to learn about human behaviour and interpersonal processes. Through the interaction in the group, they discover more about themselves, their strengths, styles, interpersonal and group interactions, how they impact and are perceived by others in the group. There is no pre-determined agenda or topic and the group uses the present experiences and spontaneous interactions to reflect, give and receive feedback to each other and experiment towards their learning. The facilitators help to create a climate and hold boundaries for such learning.

Basic Laboratory on Human Processes (BLHP)

Objectives

To help participants:

- Become aware of their patterns of behaviour and its impact on others; also know the impact of others' behaviour on them.
- Identify and work on issues critical to their own growth and effectiveness.
- Improve their effectiveness in interpersonal interactions and derive greater satisfaction from them.
- Recognise feelings, diagnose needs and improve their ability to handle differences effectively.
- Discover their potential to live life more meaningfully.

The Basic Lab is meant for any person interested in personal growth and developing his/her personal and interpersonal competence. People working in NGOs, Govt., Academia, Corporate Sector, as well as independent consultants, psychotherapists, social workers, homemakers & students, all can benefit from this Lab. It is very useful for those who work closely with others in groups or teams.

Advanced Laboratory on Human Processes (ALHP)

Objectives

To help participants:

- Deepen learning and experimentation initiated by them in the Basic Laboratory on Human Processes (BLHP).
- Develop greater awareness of current behavioural processes associated with their life and work on dilemmas faced in the context of perceived realities.
- Practice skills of observation of human processes and intervening effectively with others.
- Become familiar with group dynamics and how these impact behaviour of individuals.

The Advanced Lab is an intensive learning opportunity for individuals who have participated in a Basic Human Process Lab (BLHP) and are now interested in continuing their growth. Only those who have participated and been cleared in a Basic Human Process Lab or its equivalent (L-Group/Human Relations Programs in laboratory mode etc.) can apply for an ALHP.
